Assemblyperson Mike Gipson

- "Star in the 64" recognizing small businesses
- Redistricting effective January 2023
- Has put through 22 Bills, 12 are on the Governor's desk now

- In 2023, will reintroduce Bill 1864 Tax Credit Bill to encourage local hiring; states any small businesses to hire employees within a 5 mile radius will receive \$1,000/employee

- Bill 2271 Los Angeles Metro incentive permits LA Metro Transit Authority to offer contract incentives to small local businesses with 5% bid price reduction

- Bill signed in July 2022 dealing with Ghost Guns: toughest in the country; New York and CHicago to model this Bill

- Trying to remove barriers for ex criminals with expungement clinics
- Expanding digital access through broadband
- \$2.28 billion to district for training center

- Charles Drew University of Medicine and Science received \$50 million to help produce more local doctors and nurses of color

- \$10 million to ML King Community Hospital
- \$110 million to IOW in conjunction with Port of Long Beach
- training center to be in Wilmington to educate people on the trades

 Five year infrastructure plan, \$500 million for repaving; largest Measure A investment to date (Artesia Blvd., Cherry, Harding, South St, Downey Ave, Long Beach Blvd)

- Police Department has added to its budget a Bureau of Collaborative Response and Engagement which will house a number of community programs; to include 15 additional bike officers and 4 additional quality of life officers to the business corridor (4 of the bike officers and 1 of the quality of life officers exclusive to the north division - main focus to be park and business district)

- Staffing down; added additional outreach support staff

- \$500k allocated for mural upkeep

 Michelle Obama Library hours to increase to included Mondays, 12pm-5pm

- Luxury Inn on Long Beach Blvd. to be purchased by the city and converted to supportive housing

- Forest Park grand opening October 26, 2022 5pm-6pm; flier to come within a week
